





Security Labels / Agreements

What is the minimum "required"?

Export Security Label:

- Non Technical (Accessible by everyone with appropriate PTC Windchill access)
- EAR (Export Administration Regulations) (Accessible by US employees and agreement members)
- ITAR (International Traffic in Arms Regulations) (Accessible by US employees and agreement members)


· Proprietary Security Label:

- Non Proprietary (Accessible by everyone with appropriate PTC Windchill access)
- BAE Systems Proprietary (Accessible by US employees and agreement members)
- Third Party Proprietary (Accessible by US employees and agreement members)

Safety Valves

· Five Safety Valves

- Not Reviewed security label values
- Workflow managed security label
- Security labels details section
- Security labels displayed in views
- Workflow checking of legal / business rule compliance



Security Labels PTC Live Global

First Safety Valve

Not Reviewed

- Not Reviewed value for both of the previous labels.
- Does not have an associated agreement (Accessible by US employees only)
- Default value for object creation, set by Site OIR (Object Initialization Rule)



Security Labels

Second Safety Valve

Workflow Security Label

- Managed by the workflow, not the user
- Values: Unlocked, Locked
- No associated agreement (Accessible by US employees only)
- Not visible to users during object creation (hidden by OIR)
- Only visible to Administrators via Manage Security (A safety valve on the safety valve)
- Designed to handle multiple objects
- Allows continuous object labeling / relabeling before final "release"

Third Safety Valve

Security Labels section on Details tab

- Uses a Data Utility (Java class to create GUI components – Customization Guide)
- Links to current agreements, if any (10.2 M030)
- Links to create an agreement, if necessary (Agreements Administrators)
- Display relevant warnings about the implications of the current values






Fourth Safety Valve

Fifth Safety Valve


Workflow Checking

- Not Reviewed is not a valid Released/Completed value
- EAR part can not have an ITAR describe by document
- Non Technical part can not have an EAR or ITAR describe by document
- Additional rules as business or legal requirements dictate



Agreements Management

- Report/Utility
 - Display; export, modify, and import xlsx files (modify and create agreements)
 - Makes agreement management easier

- Understand your global access (employees, customers, vendors local, remote)
- · Plan your security labels architecture
- Plan how to properly label existing data (automatic, manual, both 10.2 M020 batch utility)

- · Test, test, test
