<b>Details</b>	<p><b>Additional Information</b></p> <p>Description ----- How to add the "purge" action to the right mouse pop-up menu in the Windows Explorer on Windows 2000/XP.</p> <p>Alternate Technique ----- See Resolution below.</p> <p>Resolution ----- Within Windows Explorer application, select "Tools", "Folder Options...", then select the "File Types" tab. Scroll down to select the "File Folder" item and then select the "Advanced" button. Create a new action by selecting the "New..." button. Enter "Purge" in the field labeled "Action" and enter the following text as the "Application used to perform action":</p> <pre>C:\winnt\system32\cmd.exe /c cd "%1" &amp;"C:\ptc\proe2001\bin\purge.bat" *</pre> <p>The default path on Windows XP to cmd.exe is c:\windows\system32\cmd.exe.</p> <p>Note: The directory paths "C:\winnt\" and "C:\ptc\proe2001\" may differ from one workstation to another; the correct path should be entered according to the actual installation directories of Windows 2000 and Pro/ENGINEER respectively. This procedure is provided by PTC for the benefit of the customers. It is neither certified nor supported. Once an "Action" has been added to a "Folder" or "File Folder" within Windows 2000 or Windows XP the action cannot be removed or modified without editing the registry.</p> <p>Warning: Editing the "Actions" associated with the "File Folder" object in Windows XP may cause the Search Companion to start when double clicking folders.
